Molesey Lock will be closed from 29 October 2018 to February 2019 for resheeting of the gates (for those who didn't realise). Please bear this in mind if you were planning to book an up river boatyard for winter maintenance (eg Bridge Marine, Chertsey Meads).

The Committee has decided it's time for a major refurbishment of the ferry and plan to use Chertsey Meads, subject to satisfactory quotations for the work. So the ferry will be away from the island from late October until further notice.

An ad hoc ferry service will be provided for the Firework event but the AGM/Laying Up Supper will be off the island as in Beverley's note. In the meanwhile please, please, please make sure the ferry is securely padlocked to the island before you leave. It is a valuable piece of kit for us - and others!
