#### From the Committee:

Committee members were pleased to welcome Vince Hoar, Waterways Technical Officer with the Environment Agency, to the meeting. We discussed the issues we had had with overstaying moorers last summer and what we could practically do to improve the situation with Vince's help. We will be taking forward the question of notices with more "do's and don'ts" to help. The current notices on other EA 24-hour moorings are being removed whilst new arrangements for management are being made. Any threat of violence should be reported to the police on 999

Affiliations: RYA, ATYC, RTS, RTA SBC is affiliated to –

- Royal Yachting Association (RYA): is the primary organisation for representation of boaters generally. They are the recognised standard setter for training in boat handling and associated knowledge. RYA can also provide legal advice to members and member clubs.
- Association of Thames Yacht Clubs (ATYC): represents the Thames based clubs' views at meetings with the Environment Agency and Port of London Authority. Main events to draw member clubs together – annual rally (this year in West India Dock) with a boating competition and a dinner/dance.
- River Thames Society: promotes use and preservation of the Thames. We receive a quarterly magazine which you'll find in the clubhouse; there are groups based on stretches of the river (Teddington to Old Windsor) which meet for occasional talks, lunch and walks.
- River Thames Alliance: is an organisation linking interests on the Thames to promote the objectives of a five-year plan including development of commerce, education and leisure. It has facilitated a meeting for all 'Thames MPs' at the end of April.

We currently have 3 members' boats requiring BSS certificates and arrangements will be made for an examiner to visit the island during May.
