From the Committee:

The Committee met on 7th May, on the Island, when we were forcibly reminded of the presence of one of our regular live-aboard visitors who had been present on the Island for some time and was playing music we could hear through the closed Clubhouse doors! James plans to meet the Environment Agency shortly to sort out some more effective ways of freeing the moorings for genuine cruising boaters who wish to stay overnight and enjoy the peace of our beautiful island. We have also been asking the Environment Agency to undertake some repairs to the wooden edging on the Middlesex side of the island. We are concerned that any wood that breaks away will cause a navigation hazard and it leaves bolts sticking out of the concrete. I wouldn't want to hit it with my prop or the ferry!

The question of multiple ownership of boats in the Club came up again. Please be reminded that all owners should be members of the Club <u>before</u> they buy a share in a boat. Acceptance as members is not automatic; the Committee has the right to turn people down if it feels that they are not going to contribute to the Club but just turn up to take the boat for the odd trip off the island. Also, a reminder to members with moorings to look at the terms of the Mooring Agreement that they signed (if you can't find it Linda can supply a copy).

James mentioned that the Club now owns Silver Shrimp in the last Newsletter. She is drying out at the top end of the island. If this is to become a viable Club boat available to members, we do need some volunteers prepared to help with some repair work. If you could help, please contact Andy Juric. Another idea raised was how to make access into the dinghies to come across to the island easier and safer. Ideas suggested included a more stable boat (more like a Dory), possibly the hardware for an electric motor but with members providing their own batteries, and some form of steps to get to a level lower than the jetty platform to access the boat. It was agreed to add some lower cleats to the jetty to enable members to secure the dinghy to the front of the jetty while boarding. Any other ideas to lan initially please.
