Advice received from ATYC:

Boaters Beware! The moorings at the Hampton Court Palace are now managed by the parking organisation District Enforcement (DE). The notices, which are few and far between, require boaters to register with DE on arrival – failure to register will incur a Penalty Charge Notice (PCN) of £100 (reducing to £60 if paid within 14 days). There is anecdotal evidence to show that a number of boaters have already been hit with a PCN. DE have been asked to place more notices along the moorings.

On the afternoon of Sat 1st June, the second of the club's Crew To events took place.

As final preparations were being made for departure we were treated to the sight of Roger and Susan on their brand new boat Jolly Roger II, accompanied by their family, joining us to

Following the route of the previous Crew To back in April, we motored up-stream in the glorious sunshine through Kingston. Hundreds of "land lubbers" were milling along the banks sweltering no doubt in the heat, as we cooled in the breeze created by our progress. The river was busy with all manner of boats and wildlife. Many of the water birds were taking early outings with their newly hatched offspring. So a constant look out and



much maneuvering was needed to avoid any mishap. We continued on past the magnificent Hampton Court where all but a very few of the moorings were vacant. On to Molesey Lock. With a little help from the lock keeper, we tied up then passed through with no problems (despite, as can be seen from the photographs, the drinks that were starting to be consumed!).

We continued past Tagg's Island and its many houseboats, then Garrick's Ait (unusually quiet today). As Simon and Sussan took the left hand channel around Platt's Ayot we, following so far in C'Est La Vie, took the right hand channel. Simon Price was able to point out his new boat, LaLuna, moored at Adams Marine where it is undergoing some final maintenance. We expect to see her at the club soon!

The flotilla re-grouped on the far side of Platt's Ayot and continued on to the "weir side" of Sunbury lock where we moored on the bank that runs parallel with Thames Street. Some picnicked on the bank, some on their craft, and a few went to seek out refreshment elsewhere. After an hour or so, we started to make our way back. Jolly Roger II first, followed by C'Est La Vie. Kisasmet hung back a little while Simon and Sussan on JemP stayed a while longer to enjoy the afternoon. It was wonderful to spend time with club members that we didn't previously know too well. We shared the crewing, a few drinks and a few snacks. We learned so much more about each other and have now, hopefully, a shared memory of a fun day out.



Re-tracing our route, the river was becoming quieter. As Jolly Roger II and C'Est La Vie entered Molesey lock, there was only one other boat in there with us, and no queue behind. We got back to the island shortly after 5.00pm, Kisamisket a little later. As we were packing our boats up Ray arrived in Master H (having been for a



short trip following some maintenance). He very kindly offered to ferry us all back to the Jetty then wait for JemP to come back later, but not before we got to "launch" Simon Price into the water in his Kayak! Thank you to everyone who came along. Hopefully those of you that could not make it will be encouraged to join us next time.
