
We are sad to report that **John Lavington**, President from 2009-2011 and an Honorary Life Member of the Small Boat Club, died on 11 June 2019. Happily, it was a pain-free, peaceful end in his own home where he had been cared for by a family member. He was 93 years old (1926-2019).

John and his late wife Babe were members for many years (from 1999). I have vivid memories of them approaching the Club from their home on Trowlock Island on Hutch, their Freeman 24, distinctive because of her green fenders. Babe would be on the bow, boat hook in hand, ready to pounce.

John was a real gentleman, a kind-hearted chap with joie de vivre and a strong sense of 'club'. He always had time for everyone. He was often seen with Gus Wylde at Club events, sharing reminiscences of life experiences.

Sue and I remember the President's Day that he introduced. At the first one John arranged for a bag of green ping pong balls to be dropped in the river at Hampton Court with the challenge to SBC crews to each collect as many balls as possible... The ensuing chase brought out the competitive streak in all the boat crews participating!!! So too did the dash back to the island for Babe's splendid lunch.

John worked for the Bank of England for many years,



which gave him the right to his own bank account with it. The scanned cheque shows a donation to the SBC after his election as an

Honorary Life Member.

III health had meant that we hadn't seen John recently, but we know he loved and supported the

From the Committee

Andy Juric will be reviewing the moorings soon, particularly the positioning of the poles holding individual boats off the island edging. The Committee also continued the discussion about making access to the island easier including picking up Trevor's suggestion at the AGM that we cover the dinghies in some way to stop them filling up with water.

James and Dominic are continuing to press the EA to finalise the arrangements discussed for new notices and other ways of emphasising the SBC's authority as managers of the 24-hour moorings. We continue to chase the EA about the deteriorating condition of the Middlesex side of the island.

Questions were raised about formal training for people new to boating. The RYA has two inland waterways courses (crew 1 day; helmsman 2 days) – details are on the RYA website – and there is also Powerboat 2 course (2 days). If members are interested Linda will try and find details of where they are available and likely cost.


