It's been a relatively quiet time for river flow conditions; the heavy storms have created problems on the roads rather

than the river although there has been some overflow from drainage systems. The EA still has some challenges with staffing - some lock keepers are self-isolating, and they have one or two long term sickness issues so you may still find 'self-service' notices at locks. But all the volunteers have their own life jackets now SO should be fully deployed. The new mooring arrangements seem to be in operation so if you see a sign where you plan to moor please read it and comply if you need to. It's also getting busy so keep your eye out for Regatta boards and swimming events. You can get details of events by subscribing to Harbour Master notices. This will also alert you to urgent difficulties such as lock breakdowns or incidents. I have details of what is happening on this reach.

Have you ever wondered about the club's logo used on printed communications, this newsletter, clothing, pennants and signs around the clubhouse?

The club was initially one for small sailing boats. As such, the white triangle to the left depicts a sail.

The pale blue at the top represents the sky.... with no clouds!

The dark blue at the bottom represents the water.

The sky and water are delineated by waves of which there are seven to represent the seven seas.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION. Government E10 Fuel.

Please be reminded that Regular unleaded petrol is going to change to contain 10% Bio Ethanol as from September. Petrol engines for vehicles and boats manufactured before 2000 should now use Super unleaded which will remain at 5% Bio Ethanol. Continued use of regular petrol with increased Bio Ethanol will damage/rot fuel systems.
