Looking forward, I am meeting with the Environment Agency (our landlords) to discuss rental rates. I think it is inevitable that they will rise, but we are working to keep the impact to the minimum. I am sure that they will reference what is happening elsewhere in the economy as context. Hopefully all will be known by the end of August.

As for our own fees, it was agreed at the last AGM that any increases for 22/23 would apply to memberships rather than mooring or canoe storage rates. Single membership becomes £60 (from £55), joint becomes £90 (from £85) and family membership £115 (from £100). Renewal letters will be going out to all members before the end of the month showing these and any mooring fees due by 1<sup>st</sup> September.

It is vital that we have a Committee in order for the club to continue. #### Dinghies, dinghies and more dinghies!

Please remember that. if you take the last dinghy from the jetty, you need to take it back by ferry or your own boat for others to use. If you didn't get to

the island by dinghy, then don't take one of the club's dinghies to get back or you may leave someone stranded. Finally, if you do use your own dinghy, please store it on or close to your own boat, not in a club mooring spot.

#### Doors!

If you are leaving the island, and there is no one around, please check the doors (clubhouse, shed, bosun, generator and WC) are shut and locked, and return the keys to the Bosun's Locker. Don't assume someone else will do it.

#### Visitors Log!

All guests must be signed in and out of the visitors log!



Of the 346km (215 miles) of the Thames, some 160km (99 miles) is tidal. The Tideway as it is known, runs from Teddington lock down to the sea. The tide rises and falls twice a day by up to 7m (24ft) taking longer to subside or ebb (6-9 hours) than it does to flow in (4-5 hours). As well as consideration for the depth of the water on our boats, it also means that cruising with the flow of the tide, we can travel faster in relation to the shore, and it improves fuel economy.

Even though the Thames above Teddington lock is considered non-tidal, its depth and flow can be heavily influenced by the weather up-stream. Large volumes of rain out to the west can increase water volumes and flow for some time after. The lock and weir system is designed to minimise the impact.
